Play <b>Sumdog</b> online. To improve your mental maths strategies.	Insects have 6 legs. Draw a picture of a <b>ladybird</b> . Can you give it 6 legs? Can you give it 6 spots too?	Draw a picture of a <b>sunny day.</b> Can you include 1 sun, 2 clouds, 3 flowers and 4 trees.	Squares and rectangles are shapes with 4 sides. Can you draw a picture of a <b>robot</b> using 4 squares and 4 rectangles?
<b>Survey</b> your family about their favourite fruits, colours or games. Can you show the information in a graph?	Triangles are 3 sided shapes. With an adults help, cut out some <b>triangles</b> and see what pictures you can make.	Carefully, draw around your <b>hand</b> on a piece of paper. Point to each finger you have drawn to count them. Can you count your fingers? How many fingers do you have on each hand?	Can you find any <b>coins</b> ? 1p or £1 coin? Can you do some coin rubbings using paper and pencils or crayons? Can you see the numbers on the coins?
Draw a picture of a <b>teddy</b> bear. Draw 2 circles, one for the head and one for the body. Draw 2 eyes, 2 arms, 2 legs and 2 furry ears.	<b>Butterflies</b> have 4 wings – 2 on each side. Draw or paint a picture of a butterfly. Can you use 4 different colours to decorate it?	Ask a grown-up to help you look at a <b>calendar</b> or diary. Can you count the days of the week? How many are there? Can you write a list of the different days or months?	Explore your home and find as many things that use <b>numbers</b> as you can. Can you draw them? e.g. Remote, clock, etc.
